Arranged topically, it includes sections on indigenous traditions, Iberian background, the National Period in Middle America and in South America, and Hispanic sports and sportsmen in the United States.

After surviving a near-fatal scalding aged three, David Miller's life incentives emerged through involvement and achievement in a range of sports, nearing amateur international level in football and athletics. But then, needing employment, he retired at 22 to enter sports journalism. Having written on 30 sports from 120 countries for four national newspapers, Miller is perfectly placed to analyse and explain what drives those who excel in sport. This anthology of 50 epic performers provides a mirror of the emotions and commitment that drive the imagination of the many and the ambitions of the elite. From the unself-conscious self-discipline of Jesse Owens, Stanley Matthews, Jahangir Khan, Torvill and Dean and Steve Redgrave, to the fundamental loneliness and insecurity that galvanises spontaneous exhibitionists such as Jack Johnson, George Best and Alex Higgins, Miller uncovers what makes these great athletes and sports stars tick.

The Berlin Olympic Games, more than 70 years on, remain the most controversial ever held. This book creates a vivid account of the disputes, the personalities, and the events which made these Games so memorable. Ironically, the choice of Germany as the host national for the 1936 Olympics was intended to signal the return to the world community after defeat in World War I. In actuality, Hitler intended the Berlin Games to be an advertisement for Germany as he was creating it, and they became one of the largest propaganda exercises in history. Two German Jews competed in the Games while the most memorable achievement was that of black American Jesse Owens, who won four gold medals. Ultimately, however, Germany was the overall biggest medal winner. The popular success of Owens allowed the Nazis to claim that their policies had no racial element and charges of antisemitism that did arise were leveled at the Americans.

In the late eighties and early nineties, Formula One was at its most explosive, with thrilling races, charismatic drivers, nail-biting climaxes - and the most deadly rivalry ever witnessed in sport. Two of Formula One's most honoured champions and iconic figures drove together for McLaren for two seasons, and their acrimonious and hostile relationship extended even after one of them had left the team. ALAIN PROST, France's only F1 world champion, the intelligent, smooth driver with the epithet 'Le Professeur'. Ayrton SENNA, the mercurial kid from a privileged background in Sao Paulo who would become the most intense and ruthless racing driver the world has ever seen. It was a story that would have a tragic ending. As the great rivals raced to victory, their relationship deteriorated badly, beginning with the breaking of a gentleman's agreement, and public spats followed, culminating in Prost accusing Senna of deliberately trying to ride him off the circuit, and fearful that the Brazilian would get someone killed with his daring overtaking feats. And the final, sad act of this drama happened at the San Marino Grand Prix at Imola in May 1994, when Senna was killed. Featuring a rare interview with Prost, and insight from Martin Brundle, Damon Hill, Sir Frank Williams, Bernie Ecclestone, Derek Warwick, Johnny Herbert, Gerhard Berger, plus McLaren insiders and other F1 figures, Malcolm Folley provides us with a breath-taking account of one of the all-time classic sporting rivalries.

No dia 1 de maio de 1994, antes da partida para o Grande Prêmio de São Marino, em Imola, o piloto brasileiro Ayrton Senna, referindo-se à perigosíssima curva de Tamburello, dizia: «Ali, se houver um problema, só me resta fazer o sinal da cruz.» Estas terríveis palavras soariam como uma premonição. Poucos minutos depois, o seu Williams-Renault despiçava-se a quase 300 km/h naquela mesma curva. A morte em direto de Ayrton Senna, vista por mais

de 700 milhões de telespectadores, marcou para sempre a F1 e uma geração inteira de adeptos. Este livro relata pormenorizadamente a carreira do piloto, desde os tempos do karting até aos duelos com o rival Alain Prost, e revela o seu lado profundamente humano, com as suas contradições, a sua espiritualidade, os seus amores, as suas aventuras e, também, a sua relação com Portugal. Repleto de episódios de bastidores divertidos e polémicos, *A Paixão de Senna* é, simultaneamente, uma viagem à história do desporto mais perigoso do mundo e um retrato de um ícone do século XX. Rui Peleção nasceu em Lisboa em 1973 e é jornalista especializado em automobilismo. Licenciado em Comunicação Social pelo ISCSP, começou a carreira no *Jornal do Fundão*. Foi depois redator, chefe de redação e diretor de publicações como *Jornal dos Clássicos*, *Autosport* e *Volante*. Colaborou ainda com o semanário *Expresso* e a revista *Exame*. É coordenador e apresentador do programa *Volante* (da SIC Notícias) e autor do blogue de automóveis e viagens, *Grande Turismo*. Entusiasta da Fórmula 1, tem uma predileção pelos falecidos Gilles Villeneuve e Ayrton Senna, sobre o qual escreve este seu primeiro livro.

Four-time Formula One Drivers' Champion Alain Prost is one of the best racing drivers of all time. Having discovered karting at the age of 14 during a family holiday, Prost progressed through motorsport's junior ranks, winning the French and European Formula Three championships, before joining the McLaren Formula One team in 1980 at the age of 24. In his six seasons with McLaren, Alain Prost won 30 races and three driving titles and in 1985 he became the first French World Champion. In 1986 he became the first back-to-back champion since Jack Brabham 26 years earlier. In 1987, his 28th Grand Prix victory beat Jackie Stewart's 14-year-old record. However, in 1988 his brilliant new team mate Ayrton Senna won eight races and the driving title. Thus began the sensational rivalry that conspired to push two of the sport's greatest drivers to unprecedented heights of success and controversy, and the most bitter feud in Formula One history.

Millions of people around the world watched in horror on that fateful day in Imola at the 1994 San Marino Grand Prix when Ayrton Senna's car careered off the track at 190mph. The greatest driver in Formula One history was dead. In this classic sports book, reissued to tie-in with a new Working Title documentary film about Senna, Richard Williams explores the complex Brazilian who was a hero in his own country and an icon to everyone who loved not just motor-racing but sport itself. In his drive to win and his desire always to test himself to the limit, Senna embodied all that is best and most thrilling in sport.
