There are NO FMCSA guidelines or rules on sleep apnea. Previous FMCSA Proposed Recommendations on Obstructive Sleep Apnea were withdrawn by FMCSA in April 2012, and on October 15, 2013 the "sleep apnea bill" was signed into law by the President.
